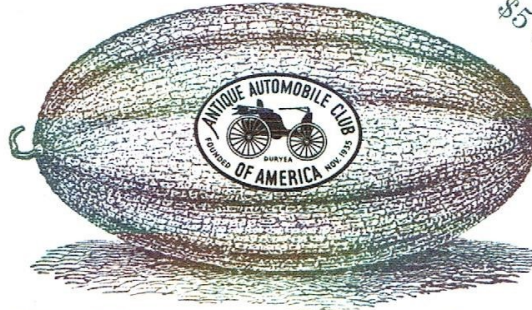

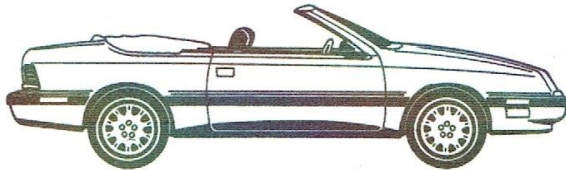

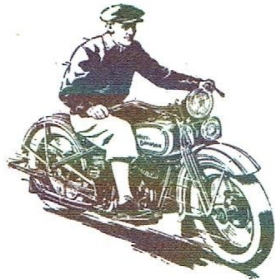

Next Meeting will be April 10 2021 at Universal Collision.

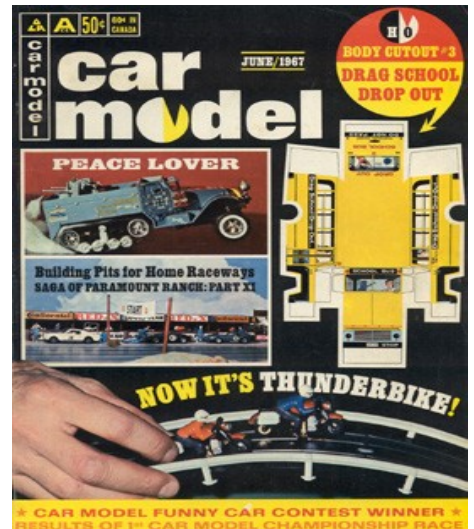
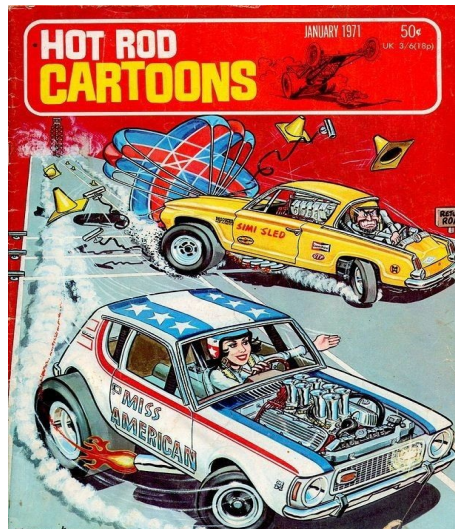
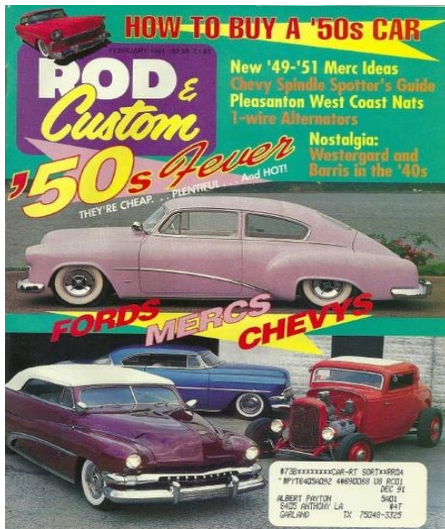
McCollum. Don and Jack Hanbury will be out of town at AACA judging school.
