

Factory PS, PB, Power Antenna, Signal-seeking AM Radio, all working Optima Battery and Cutoff Switch

Original Air Conditioning---I never finished making it work, but have all the parts

Heater

Wide-whitewall radial tires

Gas gauge is the only non-working item. I believe the sending unit is the problem, and I have a perfect spare.

Vacuum wipers don't work well. I prefer Rain-X



Includes custom fit California Car Cover, which always is on the car except when I am driving it.
Includes lots of documentation and receipts, albums and letters and photos of car's history and its restoration and from the TX dealership it was originally purchased from.
